JODI Gas reporting to UNSD

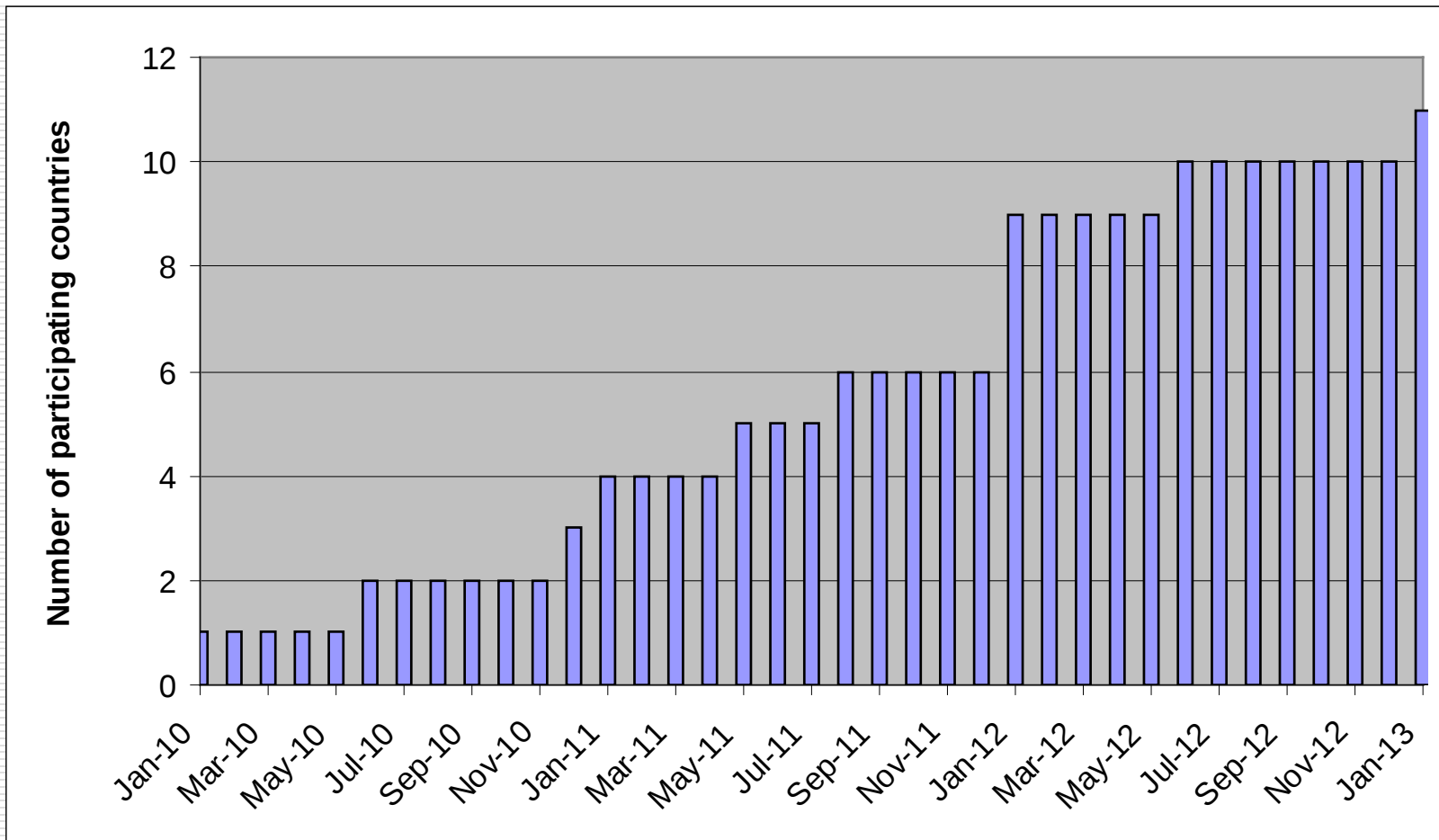
UNSD is currently collecting JODI Gas from 11 countries

- Azerbaijan
- **Bangladesh**
- **Bahrain**
- **Belarus**
- **Egypt**
- **Georgia**
- India
- Myanmar
- South Africa
- Tunisia
- Ukraine

Since the 2nd Gas Data Transparency Conference in 2012, five new countries started to report JODI Gas

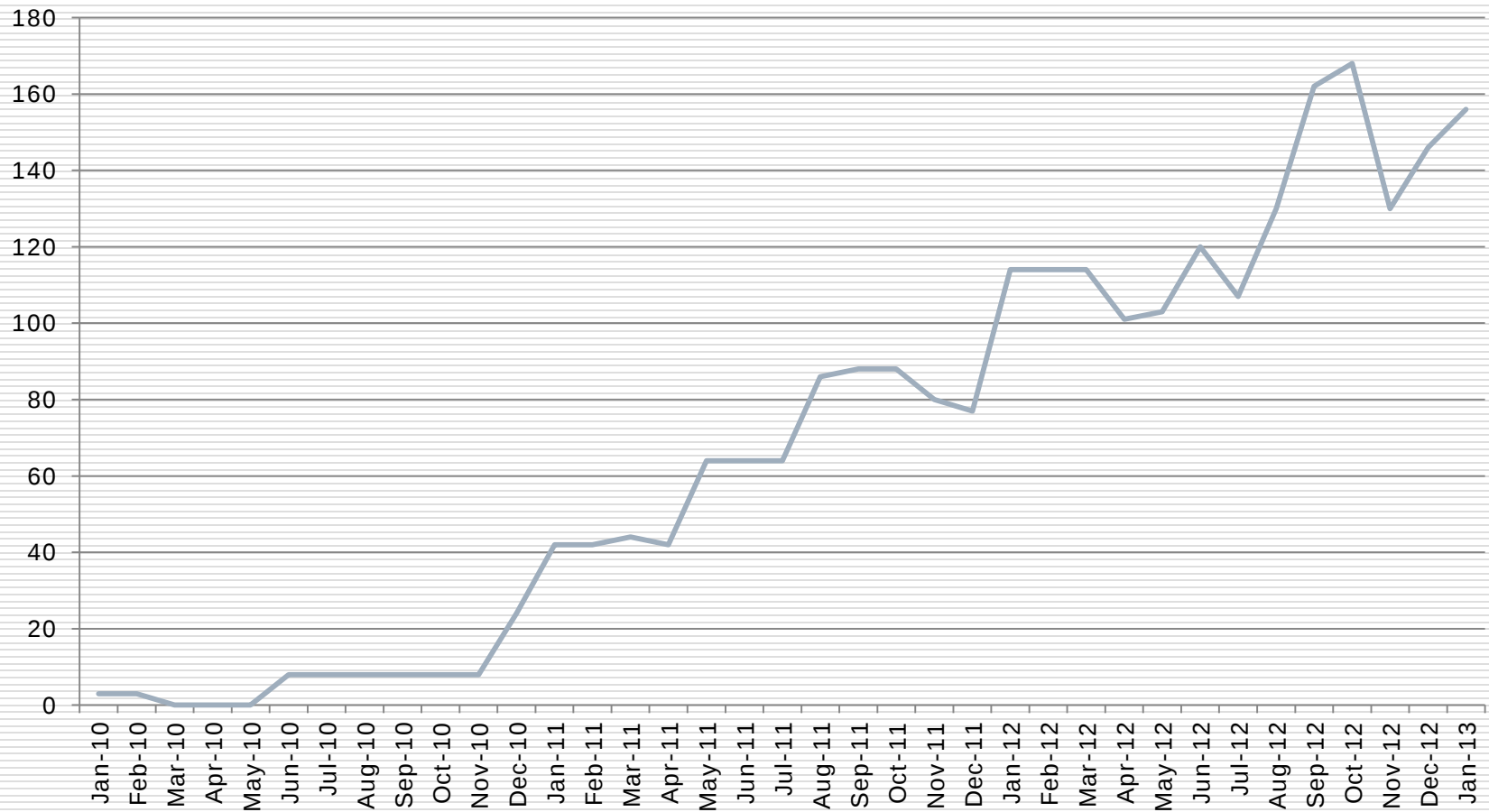


Number of participating countries





Number of data points reported





The graph displays the annual number of publications for various countries from 2010 to 2013. The Y-axis represents the number of publications (0 to 30), and the X-axis represents the year (2010-01 to 2013-03). The data series are as follows:

General remarks

- The number of participating countries is steadily increasing
- The completeness of the reported data is improving
 - E.g. countries previously submitting data on in m3 or TJ now report data in both units

Some challenges still remain

- Data gaps
- Measurement units/Conversion factors
- Timeliness
- Sustainability

We work very closely with countries to resolve these issues.



Initial findings from Beta Testing

- The JODI Gas database was circulated to countries reporting to UNSD to:
 - Review their data
 - Provide feedback on the database in general
- The feedback received from the countries was overall positive
